# UNITED STATES COURT of APPEALS for the THIRD CIRCUIT INSTRUCTIONS for ORAL ARGUMENT

## Substitution of Counsel

Counsel shall give the Clerk's Office at least **24 hours notice to substitute counsel** arguing before the Court. Substitute counsel must be a <u>Third Circuit Bar</u> member. An <u>appearance form</u> must be filed via CM/ECF as soon as possible.

Please advise the court crier or the Clerk's Office of emergency substitutions of counsel made on the morning of oral argument.

## **Division of Argument Time**

Multiple counsel arguing for parties on each side shall inform the Clerk's Office of the following by filing a <u>division of time form</u>:

- The order of argument for each counsel and party.
- The division of time for each counsel and party.

## **Registration of Counsel Prior to IN-PERSON Oral Argument**

- **Before court is in session**, counsel shall register with the court crier in the designated courtroom.
- After court is in session, counsel shall register with the Clerk's Office on the 21<sup>st</sup> floor.

# **Oral Argument Procedures**

At the outset of argument, counsel shall state for the record:

- Name of counsel.
- The parties represented.
- The amount of rebuttal time reserved for Appellants/Petitioners, which is subtracted from counsel's total argument time.

## **Cross-Appeals**

Cross-Appeals are argued together with the initial appeal pursuant to Fed. R. App. P. 34(d). In this Court, the appellant/cross-appellee argues first followed by the appellee/cross-appellant. The appellant/cross-appellee may reserve time for rebuttal. The appellee/cross-appellant is normally not permitted to present rebuttal on the cross appeal.

# Argument Timer

- Green light (main argument) is displayed for approximately 80% of counsel's argument time.
- Amber light (summation) is displayed for approximately 20% of counsel's argument time.
- Red light is displayed once argument time has expired.
